

Discretionary Asset Management (Mandates)¹ – October 2015

On October 31, 2015, the total amount of the discretionary accounts (mandates) stood at EUR 60,017.8 million, which reflects an increase of 0.7 percent from the previous month.

Since end December 2014, Total Net Asset Value of discretionary accounts rose by 10.7 percent, while since October 2014 there has been an increase of 5.4 percent.

Management Companies

In October 2015, Caixagest was the Management Company with the largest market share, with total net assets standing at EUR 22,162.7 million, which represents 36.9 percent of the total. BMO GAM ranks second, with total net assets of EUR 13,482.0 million and a market share of 22.5 percent, and BPI Gestão de Activos ranks third, with EUR 8,171.8 million of assets under management and a market share of 13.6 percent.

LYNX Asset Managers was the Management Company that registered the highest growth, with a 5.7 percent increase over the previous month (EUR 0.8 million). The largest growth in total net assets belonged to Caixagest that increased EUR 284.9 million (1.3 percent).

Since end December 2014, GNB - SGP is the Management Company registering the highest percentage growth, with 201.7 percent, and, also, the largest increase in total net assets, with EUR 5,237.0 million.

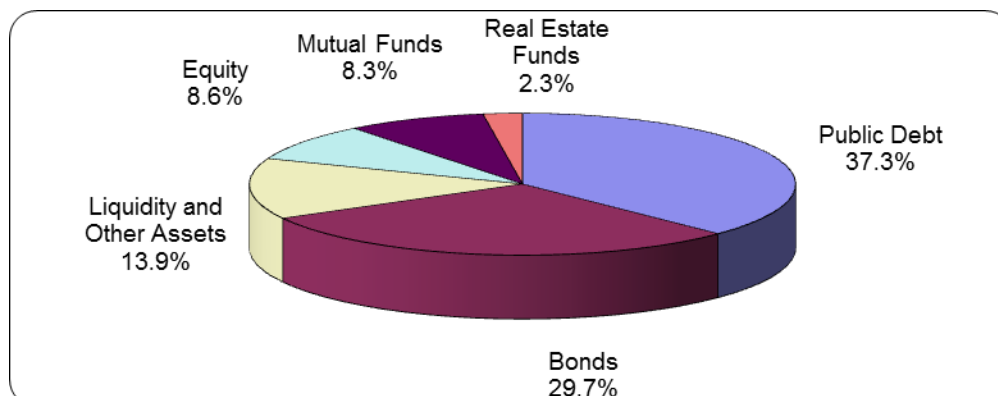

Discretionary Asset Management's Clients

Regarding the residence of clients, 97.9 percent of assets under management are related to Portuguese investors.

The majority of the portfolios under management belonged to Insurance Companies (66.7 percent of the total), followed by Pension Funds (18.0 percent of the total) and by Other Investors (11.8 percent of the total).

Discretionary Asset Management's Portfolio

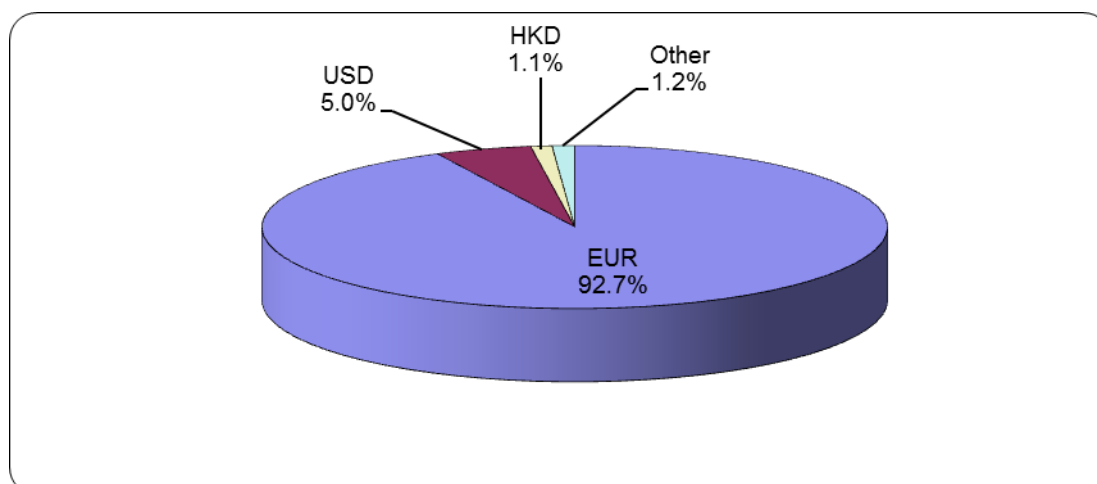


In October 2015, Public Debt was the asset class with the biggest weight in the portfolios of Discretionary Asset Management representing 37.3 percent of the total holdings. Corporate Bonds came second with 29.7 percent of total holdings.

During this month, Corporate Bonds registered the highest increase in total assets' share, up 0.5 p.p. from the previous month.

Since end December 2014, Mutual Funds is the asset class with the highest growth in Discretionary Asset Management's portfolio, rising from 5.9 percent to 8.3 percent.

In October 2015, 92.7 percent of the assets held in the Discretionary Asset Management portfolios were denominated in Euro, 5.0 percent in US Dollar and 1.1 percent in Hong Kong Dollar.
